<b>Valdese Prosecco Brut, Terre di Sant'Alberto NV Veneto, Italy</b>	£6.00	£28.00
<i>A classic Prosecco with tiny bubbles and a fresh green pear character. Bouncy on the palate with a lingering finish. (11 % abv)</i>		
<b>Brut Grande Réserve Premier Cru, Gobillard Champagne, France</b>	£24.00 (½ bottle)	£40.00
<i>This cuvée is made with premier cru grapes mainly from the commune of Hautvillers (where the monk, Dom Pérignon pioneered the production of Champagne), but with some blending with premier crus in Cumières and Dizy. An elegant nose redolent of citrus blossom, followed by a delicate and precise palate showing greengages and honey. (12.5% abv)</i>

<b>Cortese Amonte, Volpi 2017 Piemonte, Italy</b>	£5.20	£19.00
<i>The Volpi family have owned and run this Tortona winery since 1914. Cortese, the grape which makes Gavi and which dates back as far as 1659, is famous for its bright lemony freshness. (12 % abv)</i>		
<b>QL Vinho Verde, Quinta da Lixa 2018 Lixa, Portugal</b>		£21.00
<i>The Quinta da Lixa is a living testament to the passion that the Meireles family has always had for Vinho Verde. The nose is aromatic green apple, melon and white peach. The palate is white peach, apples and tangerine leading to a long, crisp finish. (10.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Petit Chenin, Ken Forrester Wines 2018 Stellenbosch, South Africa</b>	£5.70	£22.00
<i>Ken Forrester has been producing Chenin Blanc since 1993 with top winemaker Martin Meinert. This 'Petit' Chenin is a perfect everyday drinking wine with quince and pear drop flavours. (13 % abv)</i>		
<b>The Stump Jump Chardonnay, d'Arenberg 2018 Adelaide Hills, South Australia</b>	£6.50	£25.00
<i>The name pays homage to a significant South Australian invention – The Stump Jump Plough. This 'lightly oaked' Chardonnay is fresh and zesty with citrus blossom, white peach and nectarine. (13.5 % abv)</i>		
<b>Sauvignon Touraine, Domaine des Chezelle 2018 Loire, France</b>	£6.80	£26.50
<i>An intensely aromatic nose reveals fresh zesty notes with floral undertones leading to a rounded and elegant palate. (12.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Picpoul de Pinet Les Prades, Caves de l'Ormarine 2018 Languedoc, France</b>		£27.00
<i>Lively, fresh with lemony and floral touches followed by a light refreshing grapefruit finish. (13% abv)</i>		
<b>Verdicchio Classico Superiore, Casal di Serra, Umani Ronchi 2017 Marche, Italy</b>		£28.00
<i>Ripeness of the grapes is ensured by harvesting slightly later than usual and are hand harvested; leading to a dry soft palate with ripe peach, apple and hazelnuts, butter and minerality. (13% abv)</i>		
<b>Sauvignon Blanc, Jules Taylor 2018 Marlborough, New Zealand</b>		£29.90
<i>Jules loves this wine because it is so expressive of the site where it's grown. It's a grape that, within a row - and even within a bunch - has an incredible diversity of pure flavour. Vivacious tropical aromas of passionfruit burst from the glass, mixed with zingy accents of kaffir lime and subtle herbaceous notes of tomato stalk. (13.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Pinot Gris, Yealands 2017 Marlborough, New Zealand</b>		£30.00
<i>With an absolute commitment to sustainable wine production, this carbon neutral winery has carboNZERO™ Certification. A full bodied and luscious palate of poached pears and melon. (13.5 % abv)</i>		
<b>Chenin Blanc, Bogle Winery 2018 California, United States of America</b>		£31.00
<i>A true family run winery - Jodie and Warren Bogle have taken the helm and are one of our favourite producers. This Chenin is packed with juicy citrus fruit flavours, with an elegant buttery finish. (12.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Gavi di Gavi, Ascheri 2018 Piemonte, Italy</b>		£32.00
<i>'As prestige and cooling as a white sail on the blue Med.' –Victoria Moore, The Telegraph. Notes of a floral, green fruit character with a mineral undertone. (13.5 % abv)</i>		
<b>Vouvray Sec, Sylvain Gaudron 2016 Loire, France</b>		£32.00
<i>Very pale lemon yellow colour. Hints of honey and fresh hay typical of Chenin. Chalky minerality and a backbone of high acidity keeping the wine taut, energetic and fresh. Matured, without oak, in the bottle in the family's 13th century cellars hewn into the rock. (12% abv)</i>		
<b>Albariño, Eidosela 2018 Rias Baixas, Spain</b>		£33.00
<i>Bodegas Eidosela is a small co-operative started in 2003 and overlooked by Jorge M Dominguez Hervella, one of the best wine makers in Rias Baixas. An aromatic wine with hints of apricot stones and a good mineral character. (12.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Tamboerskloof Viognier, Kleinood 2018 Western Cape, South Africa</b>		£33.00
<i>The French Huguenot, Jacob de Villiers, bought the wine farm Boschendal between Stellenbosch and Franschhoek, after immigrating to the Cape of Good Hope in 1688. In the year 2000 Gerard de Villiers, a direct descendant of Jacob, and his wife, Libby, found the piece of land that stole their hearts. the name Tamboerskloof means the valley (kloof) of the drums (tamboer).(13% abv)</i>		
<b>Riesling, Trimbach 2016/17 Alsace, France</b>	£20.00 (½ bottle)	£34.00
<i>Unquestionably one of the greatest names in Alsace. It is no accident that Trimbach wines are in every one of the 3 Star Michelin restaurants in France. The acidity is so refreshing, with gorgeous grapefruit and white peach fruit. (12.5% abv)</i>		
<b>Macon Fuissé, Domaine Paquet 2018 Burgundy, France</b>		£35.00
<i>Jean Paul Paquet, his wife Monique and his son Yannick go from strength to strength. This Macon has tremendous character of fruit and soft oak character. Great value Burgundy. (13% abv)</i>		
<b>Sancerre, Le Petit Broux, Les Celliers de Cérés 2018 Loire, France</b>		£38.00
<i>Les Celliers de Ceres is the largest co-operative in Sancerre. Overt gooseberry style Sauvignon flavour mingled with hints of exotic tropical scents. Immediately appealing, crisp and clean with a good concentration of green fruit, crisp citrus flavours and a racy mineral streak. (13 % abv)</i>		
<b>Chablis 1er Cru Forests, Domaine Louis Michel 2015 Burgundy, France</b>	£30.00 (½ bottle)	£55.00
<i>The winemaker, Jean-Loup, has taken a more modern approach to fermenting, using stainless steel, with varying length of contact with the lees. This produces a fresher, crisper and more mineral finish. (13% abv)</i>

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<b>Barbera Amonte, Volpi 2018 Piemonte, Italy</b> <i>Made with selected grapes from the Monferrato area with no contact with wood. Deliciously fruity with notes of blueberries, cherries and raspberries. Robust with a persistent finish. (12% abv)</i>	<b>£5.20</b>	<b>£19.00</b>
<b>Baluarte Roble Tempranillo, Chivite Family Estates 2017 Navarra, Spain</b> <i>J Chivite family estates is one of the finest and by far the oldest with the original winery being established in 1637. Aged for 4 months in American oak and with mouth-watering black fruit character. (13% abv)</i>	<b>£5.70</b>	<b>£22.00</b>
<b>Cabernet Sauvignon Reserva, Viña Leyda 2017 Leyda Valley, Chile</b> <i>Vina Leyda lies west of Santiago and just 14 km from the Pacific. Benefitting from cooling summer breezes, this Cabernet is gentle, soft and so well structured. (14% abv)</i>		<b>£24.00</b>
<b>Bosstok Pinotage, Man Family 2017 Western Cape, South Africa</b> <i>A modern style of Pinotage, packed with full red berry and cranberry flavours, touches of cinnamon, toasted marshmallows and soft tannins. (14% abv)</i>	<b>£6.50</b>	<b>£25.00</b>
<b>La Galinière Merlot, Château du Donjon 2016 Languedoc Roussillon, France</b> <i>Jean Panis took over his fathers estate in Minervois in 1996. Exceptionally expressive flavours of dark fruits, spices and chocolate. (13.5 % abv)</i>		<b>£26.00</b>
<b>Salice Salentino Riserva, Francesco Candido 2016 Puglia, Italy</b> <i>The Mediterranean climate, low rainfall and a slow ripening period, due to the striking contrast between day and night temperatures, result in the development of dried fruit flavours and a creamy bitter chocolate character. A real treat! (13% abv)</i>		<b>£26.00</b>
<b>Estate Malbec, Humberto Canale 2018 Patagonia Argentina</b> <i>Patagonia provides a very different wine style to those raised on the heat of Mendoza. With sunfilled days and cold nights, the High Valley of the Rio Negro gives wines strong finesse and aromatic characters. Perfect with a juicy steak! (14% abv)</i>		<b>£28.00</b>
<b>Are You Game? Shiraz, Fowles Wine 2014 Victoria, Australia</b> <i>This crunchy, black fruits and cracked pepper shiraz has been cultivated in a cool climate with 10% Tempranillo. Ready to be drunk now – with or without Game! (14% abv)</i>		<b>£29.00</b>
<b>Château Sainte Marie Bordeaux Supérieur 2017 Bordeaux, France</b> <i>A husband and wife team, that focus on planting wine varieties in soils that bring out the best quality of their fruit. Predominantly Merlot, this wine is cracking value for money with excellent concentration of blackcurrant and plum fruit. (13% abv)</i>		<b>£29.00</b>
<b>Côtes du Rhône, Domaine Brusset 2017 Rhône, France</b> <i>Family run domaine in the heart of the Southern Rhône. Laurent Brusset focuses on fruit complexity to maintain a 'sense of place' in his wines. With subtle flavours of raspberries and other red fruits, this wine is well balanced and the tannins smooth. (13% abv)</i>		<b>£30.00</b>
<b>Plumbago Nero d'Avola, Planeta 2017 Sicily, Italy</b> <i>An abundance of red fruits with plum aromas, ripe blackberry and scents of cocoa – typical of Western Sicily. (13% abv)</i>		<b>£31.00</b>
<b>Bogle Essential Red, Bogle Vineyards 2015 California, USA</b> <i>This compelling blend of Old Vine Zinfandel, Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon and Petit Sirah has created a memorable and delicious wine. Aged in American oak barrels for 12 months with notes of spicy Cedar and black plums. (13.5% abv)</i>		<b>£31.00</b>
<b>Rioja Reserva, Ramón Bilbao 2014 Rioja, Spain</b> <i>Bodegas Ramon Bilbao was founded in 1924 and was awarded the best Spanish winery prize in 2014 by the IWSC. Aromas of blackberries, cedar and spices with good use of American oak. (13.5% abv)</i>		<b>£33.00</b>
<b>Ixsir Altitudes Red 2013 Beqaa Valley, Lebanon</b> <i>Named after the wide range of altitudes of the 110 hectares of prime calcareous marl terroir which IXSIR uses across the Lebanon between 800 and 1700 metres above sea level. Cabernet Sauvignon blend packed full of ripe strawberry fruit with cassis and a hint of green pepper (13.5% abv)</i>		<b>£36.00</b>
<b>Pinot Noir Reserve Awatere Valley, Yealands 2017 Marlborough, New Zealand</b> <i>In the rugged foothills of Awatere Valley, this Carbon Neutral winery is arguably the Southern Hemisphere's finest all-round producer. Hand harvested with summer red fruits and dark cherry spice complemented by silky tannins. (14 % abv)</i>		<b>£37.00</b>
<b>Fleurie Poncié, Domaine du Vissoux 2017 Burgundy, France</b> <i>Pierre and Martine Chermette are producers of serious Beaujolais, showing what the Gamay grape is truly capable of. This wine is delicate and floral and the silky Poncié tannins give delicacy and elegance. (13 % abv)</i>		<b>£38.00</b>
<b>Gigondas Tradition Le Grand Montmirail, Domaine Brusset 2017 Rhône, France</b> <i>With aromas of black cherry, currant &amp; liquorice and finishing with dusty tannins, this wine is perfect for game season! (14 % abv)</i>		<b>£47.50</b>
<b>Chorey-les-Beaune, Domaine Maillard Père et Fils 2016 Burgandy, France</b> <i>This young Burgundy has aromas of morello cherry and raspberries and has fine tannins with a lick of smooth woody vanilla. (13 % abv)</i>	<b>£26.90</b> (½ bottle)	<b>£49.00</b>
<b>Crozes Hermitage Cuvée Alberic Bouvet, Rhône, France</b> <b>Domaine Gilles Robin 2016</b> <i>This cuvee is elaborated solely with old vines from the major terroirs of the Estate (Rochas, Monico, Terres rouges). An explosion of black fruits with a good acidity, this wine has silky and round tannins. (13.5% abv)</i>		<b>£49.50</b>
<b>Château la Gurgue, Margaux 2010 Bordeaux, France</b> <i>In 1978, Jacques Merlaut and his daughter Bernadette Villars bought Château La Gurgue. Since 1993 Claire Villars-Lurton has carried on the work of her mother and grandfather. A hint of vanilla, dark berries, soy sauce and liquorice. Good tannins with eucalyptus and pine tree on the nose. (13.5% abv)</i>		<b>£75.00</b>

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
